



#### Town of Tusten Community Visioning Survey - 2024

The Town of Tusten is planning for the future and needs your input to create a successful plan!

The Town is identifying our natural resources such as forests, wildlife habitats, wetlands, etc. which will become our Natural Resources Inventory (NRI). Building upon the NRI, the Town will then create an Open Space and Recreation Plan to ensure an appropriate balance of open space, public access and natural resources.

The results of the 2020 Comprehensive Plan survey highlighted the desire for more recreation opportunities and the preservation of forest land within the Town. - Community Visioning Survey Highlights (online responses)
  - Majority of respondents are full-time residents
  - Top 3 activities include: Walking or Hiking, Paddling, and Swimming
  - 93% of respondents find open space and scenery very important








- Community Visioning Survey Highlights (online responses)
  - Top 3 types of open space to preserve: Forests, Delaware River Riverfront, and areas around lakes and waterways (ex. Ten Mile River)
  - What do you value most about natural resources and open space in Tusten?
    - Preservation of Natural Beauty and Ecosystems
    - Peace, Quiet, and Solitude
    - Accessibility and Recreational Use





- Community Visioning Survey Highlights (online responses)
  - 90% of respondents feel increasing public access and developing recreation opportunities is somewhat or very important. Priority areas include:
    - Areas of high scenic quality and/or views of Delaware River
    - Riverfront areas and other water bodies
  - What information would you like to see come out of the OSRP?
    - Preservation and Expansion of Open Space
    - Transparency and Public Involvement
    - Plans for Recreational Infrastructure and Activities





#### Stakeholder Highlights


- Update on BSA lands
  - Phase 1 of acquisition Area between Rte 97 and the Delaware River
  - Intention for DEC to manage land as State Forest which includes recreational uses
  - Existing public trails may be rerouted around scout camp
  - Will complete a Unit Management Plan with opp for public & Town comment

- What are Open Space & Recreation Priorities?
  - Can be broad (protect stream corridors) or specific (improvements to a specific park)
  - Can be short term (expand a trail) or long term (work with NYSDEC during transfer of former BSA lands).
  - Can be future connections



- How can Open Space & Recreation Priorities be Identified?
  - Town & CAC Input (local knowledge)
  - Public Input (survey, stakeholder & public meetings)
  - GIS based Mapping Tool The Conservation Analysis Tool



- Conservation Analysis Tool ("Mapping Tool") Overview:
  - GIS-based mapping tool (model)
  - Objectively identifies priorities for open space by overlapping important resources
  - Can be used as a resource by the Town and landowners for future planning and conservation efforts




- Mapping Tool Inputs:
  - Land area to evaluate (Town)
  - Conservation Criteria/Data Layers
    - Resources identified through the NRI such as wetlands, habitats, wetlands, forests, existing parks, trails, etc.



- Example Criteria/Data Layers:
  - Wetlands
  - Flood Zones
  - Wildlife Habitats
  - Existing Parks & Conserved Lands
  - Forests
  - Potential Stream or Lake Access




- Mapping Tool Process:
  - Tests each land segment against a criteria (natural resource)
  - Sums up all criteria met
  - Determines Conservation Value i.e. – How many important resources are present in this area



- Mapping Tool Results:
  - Static map that can inform the Town and landowners of important natural resources
  - Can identify potential areas for future recreation or voluntary conservation (ex. conservation subdivisions, voluntary easement, etc.)



Mapping Tool in Action-CAC Exercise


#### Example Mapping Tool

- Includes:
  - Habitats
  - Water Resources (wetlands, flood zones, streams, lakes)
  - Existing parks, Conserved Lands, Forest Management Lands
